



What is the program: "Boys of Color" is a tutoring program at Alta Vista Elementary School for minority kindergarteners and first graders deemed by the school to be in need of special help. That special help is provided by volunteer tutors. The parents of participating students have approved their child's participation.

What are the duties: Tutors work one-on-one in the classroom with the one to three students assigned to them by the teacher. Tutors help students with homework, reading and anything else the tutor and teacher might agree on.

What is the time and training commitment: Tutors ideally show up each week for one hour for the entire school year. However, the school understands that volunteers are just that and may not always be available. Tutors may pick their day. First-grade tutors start at 12:30. Kindergarten tutors start at 9:00 on Mondays and Wednesdays and 12:40 on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays.

No training is required. However, Lamb of God will provide on request a training DVD Phyllis White created based on her experience as a tutor.

Tutors must have security clearance provided by the Polk County School District. Applicants need only complete a brief form. Lamb of God pays the \$24 fee for obtaining the clearance.
